The exhibition in the Centrale Bibliotheek of the K.U. Leuven [Central Library of the Catholic University of Louvain] displayed original manuscripts and copies made by O'Cleirigh, Irish printed editions from the Louvain college and editions made by Hugh Ward, John Colgan and other Franciscans. The oldest piece in the exhibition was a fragment from a lectionary in insular script dating from c.700. Books, manuscripts and documents came from the Franciscan Library, Killiney (now partly in UCD, Dublin), and also from archives and libraries in Brussels, Louvain, Louvain-la-Neuve and Mechelen.

The exhibition was an initiative of the University Archive of the K.U.Leuven, the Michael O'Cleirigh Institute in Dublin and the Louvain University Library. A visitor's guide in English was available.

Stroomlijn Hanco Kolk. 05.10-04.11.2007

Hanco Kolk (b. 1957) is a Dutch strip cartoonist and scenarist who is especially known by the series of comic strips Meccano, S1ngle and Gilles de Geus. The exhibition in the Centrale Bibliotheek of the K.U.Leuven was the first large exposition in Belgium and the Netherlands. The exhibition chiefly focused on the recent work of this artist and was compiled around some leading themes, such as Dante's *Divina Commedia* (brought to life in a six metre long diorama), the king Arthur epic (diorama with illustrations, based on the Bayeux tapestry), women, the Meccano series of comic strips (original pages) and free work (graphic and three-dimensional).

The title 'Stroomlijn' [Streamline] refers both to Kolk's flourishing drawing style and the sculptures.

The exhibition was organised by Beeld Beeld vzw, in cooperation with the department Culturele Studies of the K.U.Leuven.

The department of artistic collections of the Université de Liège organised in the Wittert gallery between February and March an exhibition devoted to the production of manuscripts in the 15th and 16th centuries, entitled Les ateliers d'enluminures aux xv^e et xvr^e siècles à travers les collections de l'Université de Liège. This event was also the occasion for presenting the treasures of the manuscript section of the university

together with the artistic collections, an endowment fund established from the bequest of baron Wittert at the beginning of the 20th century.

Livres d'artistes. Collection cdla-Saint-Yrieix-la-Perche. 20.01-18.03.2007

This exhibition at the Musée de Mariemont displayed in the gallery of the Réserve précieuse the works of five artists represented in the collections of the Centre des livres d'artistes (abbreviated: cdla) of Saint-Yrieix-la-Perche in the Limousin, the only place in France where this type of publications is on permanent display: Herman de Vries, Jean-Claude Lefevre, Pascal Le Coq, Hans Waanders, Eric Watier. The catalogue was published in cooperation with the Centre des livres d'artistes de Saint-Yrieix-la-Perche and the Musée de Mariemont.

Within the framework of the exhibition Pierre-Jean Foulon, curator of the Réserve précieuse, gave a lecture on 20 January, entitled *Le livre d'artiste dans l'art contemporain*.
