The first international congress of the European Society for Veterinary Virology (ESVV) was held in Liège, Belgium in 1989, and through a successful collaboration with Elsevier Science Publishers we were able to publish the proceedings as a special issue of *Veterinary Microbiology* (Vol. 23) under the title "Advances in Veterinary Virology". Over 200 scientists again gathered, in September 1991, for the second international congress in Uppsala, Sweden, and it gives us great pleasure to present to you a further special issue "Advances in Veterinary Virology 2", comprising review papers and original contributions given at the congress, whose theme was "The pathogenesis of viral diseases: molecular, virological and immunological aspects."

Finally we once again extend our gratitude to Elsevier Science Publishers, and to Prof. Spradbrow, chief editor of Veterinary Microbiology, for the opportunity to publish the congress proceedings in this special issue.
