Why is networking so important?

PhD students are a vulnerable population

More likely to suffer from depression and anxiety

... and loneliness

Why? Moving cities, countries, isolation because of covid19 or writing articles for example





Why is networking so important?

Opportunities to make friends and socialize as a PhD student

Connecting with people and building strong, professional relationships

Maintain a balanced mental health

Social life can help reduce stress level

Avoid loneliness and stay sociable even when we think we don't need it

Surround yourself with people who can help you achieve your goals

Slack > volunteer to any project -- short-term or long-term --, become a relay or look for other members with the same interests as yours

Discord > discover other PhD candidates within ULiège





PhD students Discord

There are channels for almost everything: serious topics (writing, publishing, working session) and channels to share personnal topic, advice, meme and so


