Phytophagy among Necrophorus vespillo (L.) (Col., Silphidae).—At the end of September, 1953, I kept in a terrarium three adults of *Necrophorus vespillo* (L.), found under a dead bird. As any entomologist would do, I started to feed them with bad meat, but through curiosity on one occasion I introduced some leaves and buds of chicory (*Cichorium endivia* L.) into the terrarium. These were immediately and actively eaten by the three beetles. The same food was accepted repeatedly on several days, even when the *Necrophorus* also had the opportunity to feed on meat.—JEAN LECLERCQ, 17 place Delcour, Liège, Belgium: June 21st, 1954.
