1. British Constitutional Tradition

- 1.1. Unwritten constitution
- 1.2. Formal equality of all laws
- 1.3. Unlimited parliamentary sovereignty
 - * Cornerstone of the British tradition
 - * The Parliament has authority to pass/repeal any law + no other organ has the ability to overthrow an Act of Parliament (almighty) → confusion between a legal doctrine and a particular conception of authority?

2. Challenges to the doctrine of unlimited parliamentary sovereignty

2.1. EU membership

* Power is shared *de facto* → multi-level polity and ideas of shared sovereignty

2.2. National devolution


- * Dispersion of authority between the centre and the periphery
- * Creation of a Parliament in Scotland (policy divergence)
- Existence / acknowledgment of multiple demoi in the UK → multi-layered evolution of power
 - challenge to the doctrine of unlimited parliamentary sovereignty

3. Let's take back control: sovereignty and Brexit

- 3.1. Pledge of the pro-Brexit camp: recover the sovereignty of the British Parliament
- 3.2. Paradox: undermining of Westminster's sovereignty
- * Resorting to popular sovereignty: who is the British people? Was the Parliament really sovereign?
- * UK government impinged on Parliamentary powers
- 3.3. Sense of re-centralisation in Scotland
 - * Constitutive nations were ignored during the process of negotiating Brexit
