

Loeb*, col. 101 (connecting it directly with 1352), the text is cited by DILS, *BIFAO* 95 (1995), 158 § 38. — *Reproduction*: hand facsimile Morgan, *Catalogue*, III, p. 337 § 1024c, copied by Quaegebeur. — *Find spot*: rear end of the outer temple wall (reign of Domitian, late 1st century AD), over the frontal foot of Horus in the scene Morgan, *Catalogue*, III, p. 313 § 959 = PM VI, 198 § 234 (Quaegebeur). — *Date*: early 2nd century AD? for the scene in question is dated to Domitian (end 1 st century AD).






- 6) and the Falcon, the gods of the *wb.t*
- 7) Divine: 500 gods.
- Cleansed was
- 8) the *wb.t*. The burial of Osiris, *ḥwne*, was made.
- 9) He was put to rest in the temple of *jmb*?.
- 10) The beautiful name of Qenyhor remains
