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What role does the desire for emancipation play in the academic success of girls with an immigrant background ?

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1. State of the art

1.1. School performance and gender

- ▶ Girls are generally better than boys at school
(Brinbaum, 2019 ; Lafontaine et al., 2019);
- ▶ Immigrant girls are better than immigrant boys
(Dronkers & Kornder, 2014; Garnier, 2017);
- ▶ Interaction effect : differences in reading performance
(Monseur, 2017).



1. State of the art

1.2. Family and cultural environment

- ▶ Immigrant families and cultural tension (Sayad, 1991);
- ▶ Gender-differentiated education (Belhandouz, 2005);
- ▶ Social control and girls' academic success (Hassini, 1997).



1. State of the art

1.3. Emancipation and academic success

- ▶ Social control and the desire for emancipation;
- ▶ "Classical" explanation in the literature;
- ▶ BUT this "hypothesis" has never been studied in depth.



2. Research question

- ▶ Questions :
 - ▶ *What is the reality of this explanation ?*
 - ▶ *What is the ideological part in this explanation ?*
 - ▶ *What is the situation of young women in French-speaking Belgium about this subject ?*
- ▶ ***What role does the desire for emancipation play in the academic success of girls with an immigrant background ?***



3. Study population

- ▶ 15 young women (18-24 years old);
- ▶ With an immigrant background (Muslim culture);
- ▶ Students in higher education.









5. Main results

- ▶ The desire for emancipation belongs to the mothers and not to the daughters. Girls want to be "**autonomous**";
- ▶ Desire for **social emancipation**.
- ▶ **Identity emancipation**: culture, religion and community sociability.


6. Discussion

- ▶ “Colonial” vision of immigrant families (Bentouhami, 2018).
- ▶ Emancipate immigrant girls from their families ;
