Erard de La Marck (1472-1538)

- 17 October 1520: Exsurge Domine

- 12 April 1527: States allowed Edict of Worms

 9 June 1533: Forbidding to sell heretic books and loss of civil right for offenders



George of Austria (1505-1557)


 30 July 1556: Forbidding to sell libels and seditious writing



Robert of Berghes (ca 1520-1564)

 5 March 1562: Prohibiting the sale or printing of books without prior authorization and an oath of allegiance to Roman Catholicism





1568: Promulgation and printing of the Index of Rome (1564)

Ernest of Bavaria (1554-1612)

20 May 1589 & 21 March 1589

- Complete inventory of stock
- Forbidden to open boxes of books without agent
- Register with the vicar general
- Possess the Index of banned books
- Obtaining approval to reproduce a book and print it on the book




Ferdinand of Bavaria (1554-1612)

11 January 1618

Prohibiting the printing or sale of "any books or booklets unless they have first been reviewed and approved by our vicar general for spiritual matters and, in civil matters of police or State, by us or our private council."






Morberius' proximity with the government => official commissions

Heirs of Morberius: two sons-in-law sworn-printers of the prince-bishop




New sworn-printers of the prince-bishop : Guillaume-Henri Streel and Jean-François de Milst





Maximilian Henri of Bavaria granted to J.-Fr. de Milst the sole right

"to print and sell gazettes, articles on the terms of peace treaties, pamphlets, letters, notices, journals, reports, and, more broadly, all forms of ordinary and extraordinary news, regardless of their format, style, or title." (16 May 1678)
